

However in 1999, I had a very bad accident falling 30 ft.. You could say a bungy jump without a rope. Not good for the suspension I can tell you.

Held up for some time there wasn't to much I could do. My son suggested I get a computer and he would teach me the basics. This I did, and this he did, (but I'm still a one finger typist).

It didn't really satisfy me though so out came the paints, again. This time it gave me purpose, satisfaction, and even stimulated me. My family received numerous paintings over a period of time and are my true fans.

I paint mainly with oils although I'm painting with pastels a little now but find them much harder to master.

I really enjoy painting with oil, and since Pedro introduced me to the Alkyd oils, I find I use nothing else. The drying time is cut by around 75%, which is great. I feel that with oil painting you can move the colours around so easily, creating a mixture of fantastic live interesting colours.

The sky tends to be my canvas which allows me to use colours from nature's pallet . Bright colours in all various tones making backdrops for any land or sea-scape. Once I start a canvas I find it hard to stop to go on with another until it is finished.

My painting keeps my brain active I guess, (Yes I do have one), making me a happy soul, stimulating me to the point of satisfaction.

So, "Why do I Paint"?

Keeps me active in more ways than one,
Gives me a feeling of satisfaction,
