


Angela became interested in art while travelling with her husband in Europe and the United States as they visited many famous galleries. Turner, Monet and Singer Sargent became her favourite artists. She

William Rees – Vice President 2022 - 2023

I started out painting when I left school in Ballarat in the early sixties. My first teacher was Audrey Alnutt. She was a very well known local artist who taught only watercolours. After two years Audrey left Ballarat and I began art classes with Geoffrey Mainwaring. He is a featured artist in the National War Memorial in Canberra, where many of his artworks are on permanent display. Geoffrey was very traditional in his ideas, but he taught me how to paint in oils.

After I left Ballarat in early 1973, I bought into an Interior Decorating business in Melbourne. I soon realised this is the career I wanted to pursue. With training, I soon

learnt how to co-ordinate colours very quickly. I always had an interest in art, but because I was very busy building up my new business, I couldn't devote much time to it.

It wasn't until I sold my business in Melbourne in 1982 and moved to Queensland, that I was able to take up my interest in art once again. I painted under the guidance of Ali Braybrooks for a couple of years and when I became a member of RQAS Broadbeach, I joined Kevin Taylors' class, which I attended for two years.

Because I wanted to get into creative art, I joined Mal Hodges class. Mal changed my style of art immensely. He taught me how to become more creative and how to go about using bright and bold colours. That experience with Mal was invaluable to me.

Of recent times, I was being guided through a more impressionist style of art by Errol Pike. Errol uses flashy finishes with bright colours predominantly using Acrylics., because it is easier to move colours around.

Currently I am involved with an art group at Currumbin where we meet every Friday. The group are extremely diverse and have been together now for almost ten years. Every artist in the group has different styles. All are members of RQAS Broadbeach and exhibit regularly. They are having great success both with sales and prizes in the different art shows throughout the Gold Coast area.

Workshop Outline

Have you always wanted to paint in watercolour, but are not sure where to start? Are you struggling with 'technique' and need to refresh on the basics?

This two-day workshop will focus on teaching the fundamentals of watercolour technique, explained clearly and simply alongside demonstrations that you can follow. Ideally, this workshop is suited to beginners, struggling intermediate painters or those wishing to improve their technique.

There is no 'one way' to paint in watercolour. Different approaches produce very different results, and the aim of this workshop is to explore the versatility of the medium and build confidence, through:

- brush control
- paint consistencies/values
- mixing colours
- wet on wet painting techniques
- glazing (painting on dry) techniques

About the tutor: Annette Raff is an award-winning Gold Coast artist and tutor. She holds a degree in Fine Art and has taught regular watercolour classes and workshops in the Gold Coast and regional venues in S.E. Qld for over 25 years.

What to bring:

A materials list will be sent to you once your place in the workshop is confirmed. Morning tea will be available each day. Please bring your own lunch. There are cafes nearby to purchase food and drink. Parking is available close by to the RQAS premises.

NEW Three Term Art Program starts Thursday 6th October PAINTING PRINCIPLES & FUNDAMENTALS with Tutor: Jacqueline Mathe



Each term runs for 6 consecutive weeks 1 – 4pm THURSDAYS

This program will teach you the core principles and fundamentals of good painting practice and set you on a journey of discovery and technical improvement. You will be provided with clear, simple notes and given demonstrations of technique that you can follow easily and with confidence.

Ideally, this program is suited to beginners, struggling intermediate painters or those wishing to improve their technique. It is for oil paints and acrylics but not watercolours. The course is divided into Three Terms of Six lessons, covering these topics:

Term One - Tonalism, Material Handling, Observational Analysis

- Term Two Colour Theory & Application
- Term Three Composition; Achieving Powerful and Expressive Paintings

<u>About the Tutor</u>: Jacqueline Mather trained at the National Art School and UNSW College of Fine Arts. She has a Master Degree in Painting and a Master Degree in Adult Education. Jacqueline has been teaching for over twenty years and moved to the Gold Coast in 2021 with her family.

<u>What to bring</u>: Come with materials you already have for the first time. Jacqueline will discuss with you individually what will suit you and your budget. You will get a list of materials you may purchase to make your goal of improvement easier and cheaper.

<u>Program fee</u>: Each Term of Six Lessons – \$240 (RQAS member) or \$280 (nonmember). Fees are payable at the beginning of each Term. You can complete part or all of the program if there is room in the class. Class limited to 10 people.

DAPHNE VOLIN

Ever since I was a little girl I liked to draw or paint figurative subjects. 'Art and Art History' was my best subject at school. I won the annual art prize 3 years running. After leaving school I had to find work apart from art as my art was not earning. The Commercial Art option didn't appeal to me.

My life went in a different direction with marriage, work commitments and travel. Once in a while I brought out the sketch book, to sketch places where we stayed or visited. I liked to record interesting locations and buildings.

In the mid1970s, while living in New York, I had the opportunity to learn oil painting at the Art Students League as a part time student for 5 years. It was a great experience to be introduced to the medium by two notable US masters, David Leffel and (late) Ray Goodbred. One can Google them for details. David still demonstrates, as far as I know, in the classical style of the Old Masters.

Back home in Australia, art was put on hold again until 1999, 2 years after my husband passed away after 30 years together. I decided to take up art full time and became a member of RQAS Broadbeach. For several years I was on the committee and then active as gallery co-ordinator for another 2 or 3 years.



From 2001 until about 15 years ago I regularly exhibited and sold work at selected shows round the Gold Coast. I also entered, with success, two different Equine Art competitions, in Sydney and Toowoomba. Unfortunately the organizer had to discontinue these two popular events after

only 2 years, as there weren't enough helpers to organize the shows. To date, I haven't heard or found any other Equine Art competitions re-emerging around the country. *Daphne Volin*
