She will be in the office for 2.5 hours a day during the week and we look forward to getting her help with the many projects we have on the go this year. Belinda's work will not remove roster duty which all exhibiting members are required to do. Her efforts will allow us to get some headway now with some of the work we have needed help with. The Committee is simply too overloaded to do it all with so many things going on and the huge increase in visitor numbers and sales we are experiencing.

Speaking of Roster Duty, just a friendly reminder that if you do not turn up for your shift the Gallery may have to be closed if we cannot find a replacement, and you will be charged the \$25 monthly no duty fee when you hang your next works. If you are on roster please call and remind the next day's roster folks to make sure they remember but the responsibility is on you to be there as per your nominated shift. If you can't make it then contact someone on the emergency roster list – it might pay to take a photo of the list when you come to changeover in case you ever need it. Please don't call the committee as we will only direct you to the emergency list. We already have our roster shifts too or else we pay \$25 if we don't show up just like everybody else. I hope that helps clear things up.

The Art Café has reported a well earnt profit for the first quarter which is exceptional for a new business – shows what can happen when you know what you're doing and Martin and Nula sure do. They are hoping to achieve 50 more 5 star google reviews this year so jump on and help them out if you love the coffee and location as much as I do!

We are working hard on getting a grant from Council to help us paint the building. It's a long road but we have a plan and some good people (thanks to Vice President Bill Rees) ready to do the work. When we get there we will be excited to see a 'new look' for the RQAS all dressed up to turn 60.



#### Workshop Outline

The workshop is suitable for artists with some prior experience in drawing, painting and the use of colour.

#### Day 1 - 9 am to 4 pm at Gold Coast Regional Botanic Gardens.

This day will start with a brief guided walk, followed by morning tea at 10 am in the Rosser Garden. Participants will then explore the site to choose a specific tree or bark to draw, embellished with leaves, flowers, or fruit (if available) – taking notes, sketches and photos for reference. Activities during the day will include:

- photos and basic sketching of specimens in situ
- taking notes about tonal values and colours
- preliminary drawings on tracing paper & planning for a composition
- greyscale charts to understand values and know your pencils
- layering technique and exercises understanding different papers

At the end of the day all, or most of, the preparation drawings should be done to have sufficient time to progress to a final piece the next day.

#### Day 2 - 9 am to 4 pm, Royal Qld Art Society (RQAS) studio, 25 Broadbeach Boulevard, Broadbeach.

Bark can be a daunting subject to paint. With some simple instructions and methodology, participants will be able to tackle a small piece in graphite. A coloured element included in the drawing will provide extra interest and some identification features such as leaves, flowers and fruit if available. We will setup in the RQAS Studio to start the final drawing. Activities will include:

- learning about tonal value mapping
- rendering bark texture
- layering graphite grades
- basic colour mixing

Once your booking is confirmed you will be sent a detailed materials list and map of the gardens.

## IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT FOR ALL RQAS GC MEMBERS

#### **RED FOLDERS AT FRONT DESK**

We are changing our front desk record keeping. Small Art, Gift Shop, Sculpture, Cards are to be recorded in the two large **RED FOLDERS** (marked A - K and L - Z) where all other art information is kept. We want to have just those two large RED FOLDERS to record all art and artist details to simplify matters. It is then just a matter of going through the alphabet to find the artist's details and to record the sale of their work, be it paintings, sculpture, small art, gift shop, cards.

All art sold must be recorded **BOTH** in the receipt book and the RED FOLDERS so office personnel know WHO had WHAT sold and for HOW MUCH. That is the only way we know to pay artists for their work.

#### **RECEIPT BOOK SNAGS!!**

If sale details are recorded illegibly in the receipt book and not recorded in the RED FOLDERS we have no way of knowing who is owed what. We have no way of paying the artist. The Gallery is for all of us. In order to be paid for our art we need ROSTER personnel (all of us) to be DILIGENT in recording clearly, in **LARGE READABLE, print** just what was sold (title of piece, card, etc.) who was the artist and how much.

We also need to have **recorded the NAME OF THE PERSON MAKING THE PURCHASE and some contact details.** Some buyers don't want to give their address so please ask for their phone number and email instead. This is to ensure their bank transaction is ok.

To date, ROSTER personnel sometimes do not record sufficient detail or write legibly for us to pay an artist for their work without going through a huge process to track down who sold what to whom. Please, when on roster, make sure your receipt contains all the following details in **LARGE READABLE PRINT**:

- 1. Customer's Name, phone number and / or email
- 2. Artist's Name
- 3. What was sold (painting, sculpture, card, jewellery etc) & Title of work or Reference number
- 4. Price
- 5. Circle if paid by eftpos, cash, bank transfer
- 6. SIGN THE RECEIPT and PRINT YOUR NAME CLEARLY

PLEASE CHECK THAT DETAILS HAVE BEEN RECORDED ON ALL THREE RECEIPTS. This is essential for our record keeping and so we can pay the artist whose work sold. Rewrite the blue, bottom receipt if you cannot read the details easily. It helps our team.

#### MORE ON THE RECEIPT BOOK

- 1. White receipt goes to customer with CUSTOMER eftpos receipt (second receipt printed by our eftpos machine)
- 2. Yellow receipt with money or MERCHANT eftpos receipt goes into plastic bag, then into brass slot on OFFICE DOOR.
- 3. Blue receipt is our record for auditors.

We are working on new receipt recording system, so please stay alert to any changes.

#### EFTPOS RECEIPTS

There are two – MERCHANT RECEIPT, CUSTOMER RECEIPT

When you put sale details into the eftpos machine an automatic receipt is printed. This is the MERCHANT receipt. Press the button again to get the CUSTOMER receipt. ALWAYS GET TWO RECEIPTS FROM THE MACHINE.

Ensure the eftpos receipt is not DECLINED!! If it is, start again OR with another card or ask for cash. If a buyer goes off with an artist's work and hasn't paid we CANNOT pay the artist.

When any item is sold please contact the artist to let them know so they can replace their sold piece with another work. Not only is it an exciting moment for the artist but shows courtesy from those on roster duty.

During your shift please contact people on roster for the following day to remind them of their shift. If they are unavailable please remind them of the \$25 non-duty fee they are required to pay or make up the shift during another month by doing an extra shift. Then phone someone on the emergency list attached to the monthly roster to ensure someone can come in to do the roster and open the gallery. Can you register to be on the emergency roster list a couple of times per year? That would be most helpful.

#### **ONE MORE THING!**

**Gallery keys** – as some may have already seen, we have a new key locker. Enter the Code by scrolling individually for each of the four numbers, pausing in between each, and *the safe* will open. If you can't see the numbers properly there is a button to press for a light to illuminate the numbers. When you've finished scrolling and you have the keys ENSURE you ALTER the numbers so the code is not shown to passes-by.

#### FOR NEW MEMBERS on ROSTER DUTY

Please ask for training in order to be effective on the front desk. The Gallery is a business which depends on the sales it makes and each of us has a role to run the business when on roster.

On your first shift please read through the **FRONT DESK INFORMATION folder**. It will help you stay on track with your responsibilities. Have fun talking to the visitors too and ask them to choose their favourite painting.



**BIG ART** awards are in September. A condition of entry is that you must have exhibited your work at least three times during the year ie exhibited for three months, to be eligible to enter. There are five months before the big art awards in September so you have

plenty of time to exhibit your work 3 times before then.

## Fees to exhibit our art

**EVERY EXHIBITOR IS REQUIRED TO BE ON A ROSTER SHIFT ONCE PER MONTH UNLESS A FEE OF \$25 IS PAID as well as paying for each item exhibited.** We understand that some people cannot do a roster so the \$25 fee covers someone doing the shift for you. When people don't turn up for their rostered shift and there is no one to replace them, the gallery cannot open which means a loss of sales and no public exposure. You will be charged \$25 non-duty fee next time you exhibit your work. Very sorry we have to do this. For security reasons and helpfulness during busy times two people are required to be at the front desk every roster shift.

If you can do an extra shift anytime please let us know – or register on the emergency roster list.

20% COMMISSION ON ALL SOLD ITEMS IN THE GALLERY. 10% FOR ART IN THE PARK ITEMS.

WHOLE WALL HIRE (Red wall or wall facing the beach) \$165 for one month. No roster shift.

**HUNG PAINTINGS** - \$10 per painting PER MONTH or \$15 for two paintings (max number we can have unless we book a whole wall). If our work is sold we can replace it with another painting for the rest of the month.

**GIFT SHOP** - \$15 for 3 MONTHS for a shelf space. If work is sold we can replace the pieces for the rest of the 3 months without incurring a further fee. **Contact** – **Sandra De Leacy 0411 369071** 

**SMALL ART** - \$5 per piece for 3 MONTHS (2 Pieces + 1 extra IF displayed outside). If work is sold we must pay another \$5 for a new painting to be displayed – the 3 month rule then applies to this new work. Contact – Jo Sampson 0429 626 140

**SCULPTURE** - \$15 for 3 MONTHS for a plinth or free standing (for large sculpture or coffee tables etc). Sold work can be replaced without a further fee for the rest of the 3 months. Contact – Jo Sampson 0429 626 140 or Sandra De Leacy 0411 369071

**CARDS** – free to display – max of 5 at any time, 20% Commission

**ART IN THE PARK** – free to display work, 10% commission applies
